## HEALTH

Fundación Total's ¡Oye, Bolivia! (Hear, Bolivia!) programme, graciously supported by CBM (Christian Blind Mission), continued to lead the way in Ear & Hearing healthcare in the Beni region in 2017.

Our surgical facilities saw 80 people treated throughout the year, including 17 in mid-October, when Dr. Richard Wagner (USA) of Global ENT Outreach came to lead our annual surgical campaign. Much time and energy was set aside throughout the year to prepare for the campaign, with FT's Health staff making residential visits to the remote villages of Puerto Varador, San Pablo, Riberalta and Reyes, in order to carry out checks and refer any patients in likely need of specialised surgery.

Our ENT (Ear, Nose & Throat) service was offered daily, throughout the year. Surgeon Dr. Guillermo Azogue ran morning consultations and oversaw surgery, and his work was complemented by Ear & Hearing Care practitioner Dr. Romina Ribera, audiologist Odalys Arce, and speech & language therapist Mayerlin Garrón. Claudia Arroyo headed up the ¡Oye, Bolivia! programme.

Of particular assistance in this area in 2017 was a visitor from South Korea, Dr. Yeon Sup Yoon who, through Global ENT Outreach, made contact with FT early in the year and came to work with us from March until October (see 'Volunteers' section, below).

As ever, much of the work of ¡Oye, Bolivia! took place in other locales in Trinidad. Regular hearing checks took place in health centres, day-care centres, schools and in Trinidad's maternity hospital.

Training in Ear & Hearing healthcare was again provided by FT staff, via our World Health Organisation-approved course on Ear & Hearing Care. 299 people attended four courses held in various locations in Trinidad in 2017. FT staff themselves attended various workshops held throughout Bolivia. Speech therapist Mayerlin Garrón participated in workshops on infant hearing deficit diagnoses, speech disorders and autism. Audiologist Odalys Arce attended workshops on hearing aid formatting and statistical reporting.

The work of ¡Oye, Bolivia! was complemented by the wide range of health services offered on our premises, including paediatrics, dentistry and general medicine, where Dr. Ana Yensy Semo joined us as our afternoon General Practitioner (Ana Yensy also supported the work of ¡Oye, Bolivia! in the mornings).

## EDUCATION & COMMUNITY

Fundación Totalí's afternoon classes for local children were modified in 2017 to better meet the needs of our community.

Rather than allocate different age-groups to different days, as has been the practice in the past, all children from ages 4 to 12 were invited to attend the classes on Wednesdays and Fridays. As the children gathered in the first half-hour of each class, time was set aside for help with homework, for those who wished it, or simply for play. After a snack, the children were then separated into two groups. The group of 4- to-8-year-olds were taken by FT's Education & Community Director, Carla Camader, while her assistant, Victor Elías Ramos, took charge of the older children's group. Carla led the younger children in interactive Bible lessons, involving techniques as wide-ranging as arts & crafts, puppets and drama. Each week

a new verse was given to the children to memorise. The older children studied Paul's missionary journeys under Victor Elías' guidance, using an inductive Bible study method; having listened to the lesson, they were asked to write down, or draw, what they had learned. Both teachers aimed to use their lessons to improve the basic reading and writing skills of the children present.

Meanwhile, on Mondays, Carla and Victor Elías again ran a discipleship group for teenagers, using a book called 'Amor Radical' (Radical Love). This book addressed themes relevant to teenagers, such as sexuality, drug use and dating, from a Biblical perspective.

FT's Community Arts & Crafts ministry, led by Dr. Ruth Obando, again took place on Saturday afternoons, with women from the community gathering to make textiles together. On two occasions, the group were invited to display and sell their work at Trinidad's 'Casa de la Cultura' (Culture House). A short devotional time took place every week. As well as the usual display to mark the end of the year, in 2017 the women also organised a special event for Mother's Day, where an invited speaker gave a short talk to the women and the various friends and family members present.

At the end of 2017, owing to declining interest, the decision was taken to bring to a close the 'Let's Play Together' programme for parents and toddlers, which met in FT's headquarters on Thursday afternoons. However, those present benefitted from a programme which not only included valuable time for parent-child interaction, but also a 30-minute discussion session each week using the book 'El Desafío del Amor' (The Challenge of Love). The book used 1 Corinthians 13 as a springboard for talking about various aspects of love and the parents were invited to thoughtfully apply these principles to their own relationships with their children.

## SPORTS

Having merged the two main training locations into one the previous year, Fundación Total's football training sessions went from strength to strength in 2017. FT Sports Director Luís Oniava again took charge of these sessions, held on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons, and was assisted by Wilson Menacho. As ever, these training sessions included a short Bible study time each week for the various teams in attendance.

Adverse weather conditions towards the end of the year meant that our football teams were unable to complete their seasons. However, at the time of writing, the under-9, under-11 and under-17 teams had qualified for their semi-finals, with the under-13s in the semi-finals of a tournament for those teams who missed out on the main knockout stages. The various pitches remain waterlogged at the time of writing.

The basketball ministry followed a similar format for its training sessions, led by Victor Elías Ramos, and two teams represented FT in the local leagues. The under-15 team finished in fourth place overall, while the under-12 team did not qualify for the latter stages of its tournament.

The Sports area again organised special evangelistic activities in the community throughout the year. In July, coinciding with the mid-year school break, a 5-Day Club was held on the premises of a local primary school. Around 60 children were in attendance for a programme of games, arts & crafts and Bible teaching. At the same venue, the Sports team, in collaboration with the Education area, ran a 'Kids Games' programme later in the year over a period of eight weeks. Here, children from two primary 4 classes received Religious Education teaching, but with games and other fun activities used to teach the main principles of each lesson.

## VOLUNTEERS

This year saw us receive a seven-strong team from Scotland for a two-week visit in July.

The Kelly family (parents Laurence & Penny; children Aidan, Duncan and Hannah), Ethel Cunningham and Sarah Wadsworth, from Strathaven Evangelical Church, got involved in a range of activities across Fundación Totaí and our local evangelical church, 'El Jireh'.

In their first week here, the team played a big part in the running of the 5-Day Club (see Sports summary, above), overseeing the arts & crafts activities and performing a short drama each day. In their second week, much of the team were involved in painting a mural in the classroom used for the afternoon classes for children in the community. Duncan Kelly also assisted with football training sessions.

In the church, the team took charge of teaching sessions at both the children's and teenagers' meetings, using a range of creative and interactive strategies in order to teach Bible stories to the attendees.

It was a privilege to welcome such a hard-working team to Trinidad, and particularly to see the interest they took in the lives of the various individuals we serve.

As mentioned in the 'Health' section, above, the work of the Health area was greatly supported for much of the year by Dr. Yeon Sup Yoon, from South Korea. Yeon held ENT consultations from March till October and performed surgery.


## FINANCES & ADMINISTRATION


